Commencement & completion of Aboriginal Homelessness 90-Day Project – details subject to consultation.

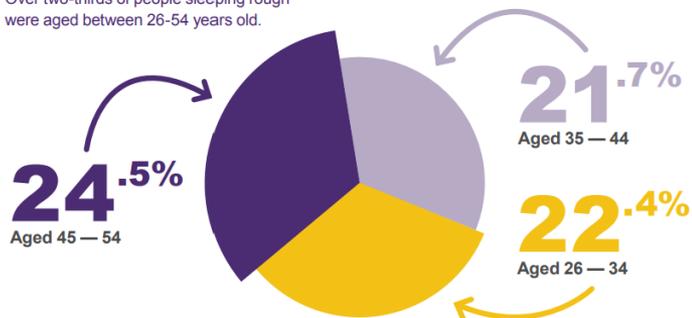

## Age of Rough Sleepers

Over two-thirds of people sleeping rough were aged between 26-54 years old.



**28%** of rough sleepers were **ABORIGINAL and/or TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER** despite being only **3%** of the overall Australian population

**73%** of rough sleepers were **male**

## Length of time sleeping rough

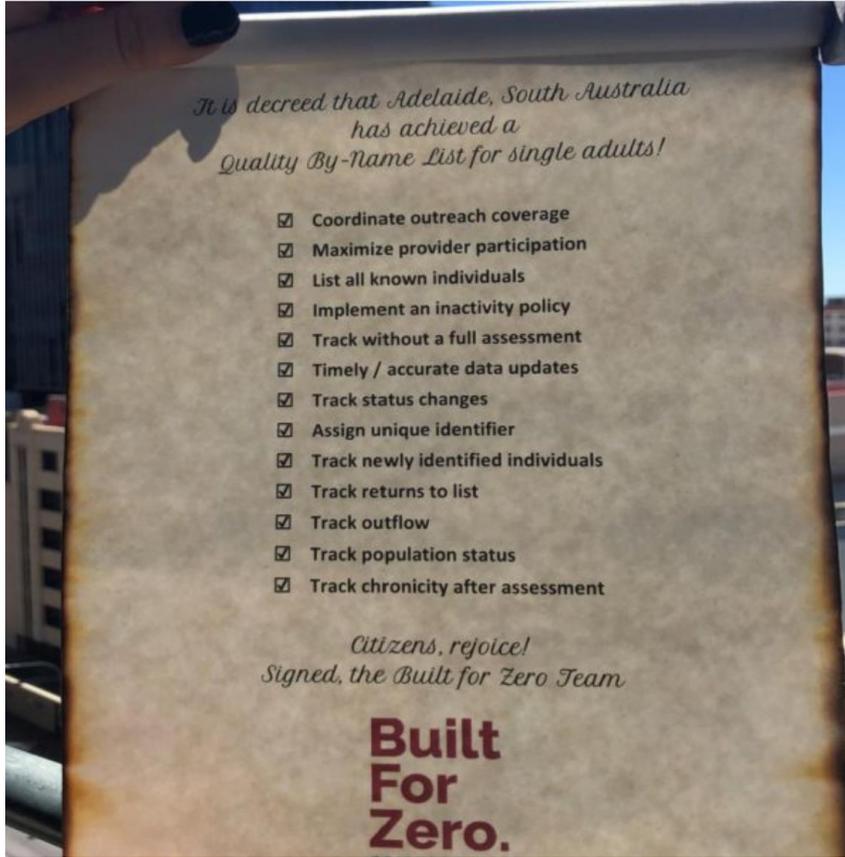
**29%** had been sleeping rough for more than 2 years

**15%** had been sleeping rough between 1 & 2 years

**35%** had been sleeping rough for less than 1 year

## Operational Meetings that support THA/AZP operations



### **Service Coordination Meeting**

Service Coordination meetings are held weekly, chaired, and resourced by THA. Service Coordination meetings focus on services coming together across sector to identify and collaborate to ensure best support for individuals who are identified as high vulnerability.

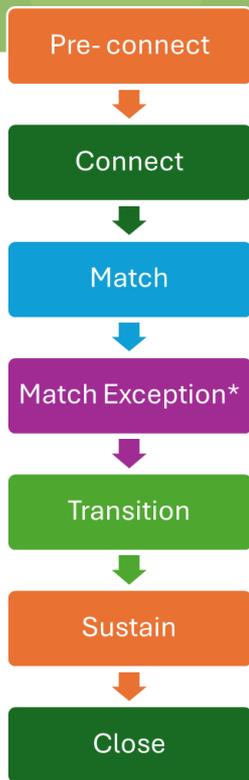
### **Adelaide Council, DHS, SAPOL and THA check in meeting**

Fortnightly meeting for stakeholders that support in the CBD Assertive Outreach space to come together and discuss individuals which have been escalated and concerns or situations have occurred. Focus on specific individuals, hotspots, situations or patterns that they are noticing through the City of Adelaide council area.

### **Toward Home Outreach Meeting**

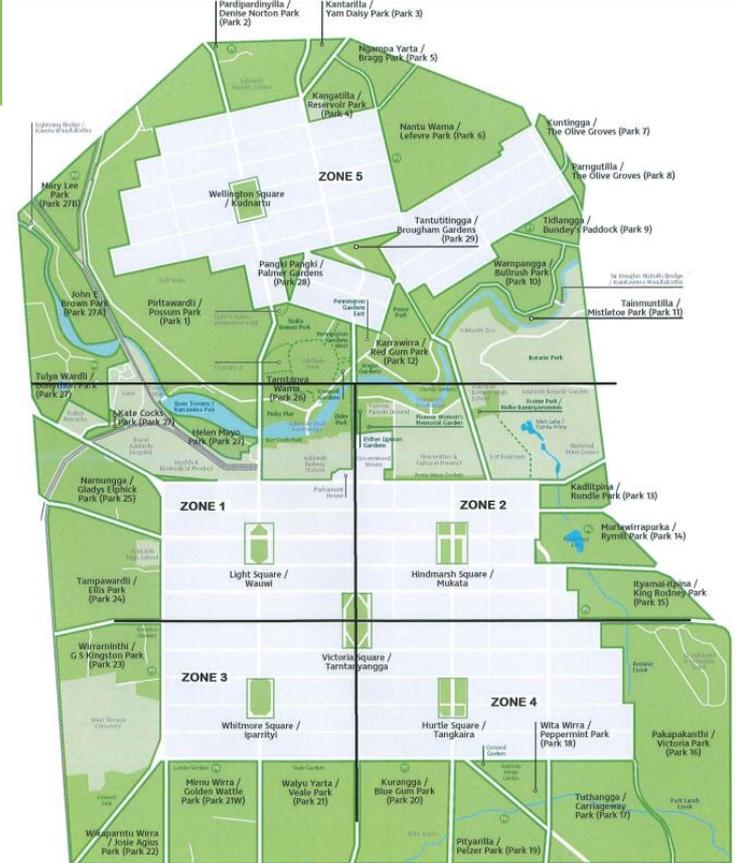
Brings key stakeholders together across THA to provide regular updates and share information for effective, safe and responsive delivery of services to support service integration, service collaboration and outreach responses. This meeting has representation from all Alliance partners who undertake Assertive Outreach and cover any operational or client escalations that need to be discussed. 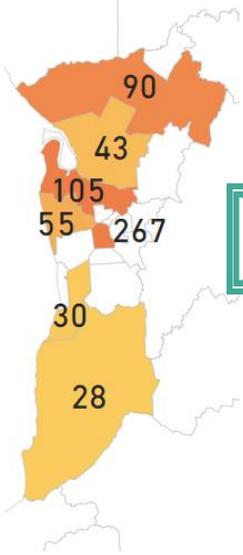


**PREVALENCE OF HOMELESSNESS**

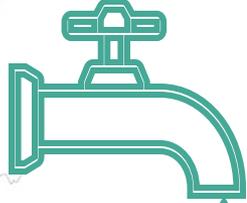

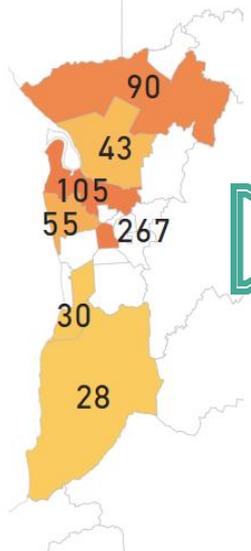

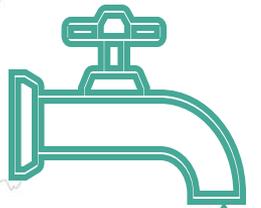

Cost savings to government	\$66.1 million	Cost savings are 1.44 times service cost
<b>Benefits to housed individuals</b>		
Value of WELLBY (wellbeing-year) benefits	\$100.7 million	The dollar value of wellbeing benefits
<b>Capital costs</b>		
Capital cost of new builds	\$29.9 million	Cost of construction
Opportunity cost of being able to sell existing buildings	\$8.4 million	The value of existing buildings at the time of repurposing for PSH
Cost of replacing/refurbishing existing buildings	\$2.5 million	Cost of replacing or refurbishing existing buildings is incurred after 30 years
